



Blended ICT Model for Outcome Curriculum

When a computer starts, it first executes a program that is stored in the BIOS of the computer. This program loads the operating system and gets the computer started. It is possible to go into the BIOS and make some changes. To do that, one needs to press the escape key what another key or combination of keys as per the manufacturer of the computer, to go into that BIOS. The above diagram shows the different options that are available in bios. In many at times, a user may go into the BIOS to alter the boot order of the disks. This is done, for example, to install a new operating system on the computer. Business students must know how to install an operating system on their computer. For example, the Windows 10 operating system is available for free from Azure for students enrolled.







An LMS Platform for Collective Learning
